Xello

Ferndown Middle School uses software called Xello to help deliver our careers programme. This software enables students to work individually on any mobile device, whether in school or at home, to explore career options for the future. Both Year 7 and Year 8 have used Xello to evaluate individual personality and learning styles, interests and future aspirations. Xello has then suggested some suitable career matches. By clicking on the match, the student can find out more about the career and the requirements.

As parents, you too can access Xello. This could provide you with the chance to discuss future goals for your child. Please ask your child to give you a demonstration!
