Note from the Chair of Governors

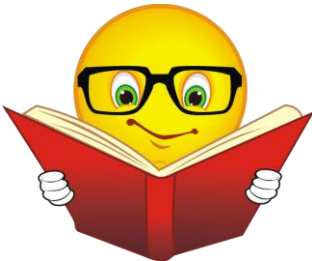

Since the end of October the Year 7 students have been working on designing and creating their own racing cars. Each member of Year 7 has been working in a team of 4 to design, create and brand their cars. They have worked on the job roles; nominating their own leaders, designers, creators, testers etc. They have been given a block of foam to design and shape their car. They have sourced their own wheels and finalised their designs.
This is now the last stage; the children are adding wheels as I write and racing it on Wednesday 7th February of this half term. We have the RAF coming in from Yeovilton to add real rockets to the cars so that they can travel at more than 100mph.
We will be rewarding students for the best teamwork, designs and creations as well, of course, for the fastest race time. The winning team may even get the chance to compete at the regional finals.

Year 8 Alcohol and Drugs Awareness Day



This week the Year 8 pupils watched a drama called 'Time in a Bottle', performed by Paul Stevens. The pupils were shown how excessive drinking can have a negative impact on a person's life and the long term consequences of this behaviour. Pupils were taught how to read the information on bottles of alcohol so they could decide if the alcohol was strong. In fact any alcohol at 5% or above is considered strong alcohol. Year 8 will receive an information sheet to share with you.

During the day the pupils also looked at the effects of taking illegal drugs and were taught ways to deal with difficult situations with the aim being to build their resilience.

It was a very worthwhile day and was positively received by the pupils.

Science Dome experience for Year 5 and Year 8

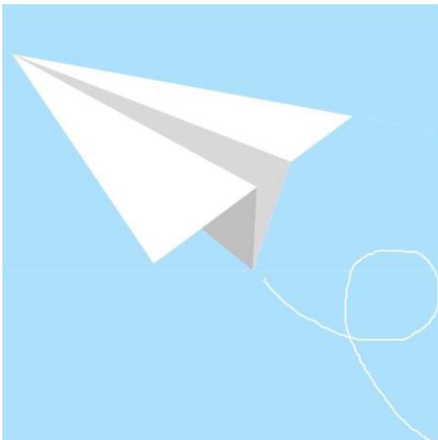
The Science Dome provides an additional science resource and presents a different learning experience to children.
