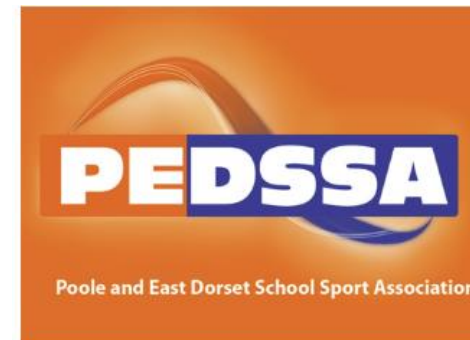
The first half produced an even contest. Both teams were trying to win the midfield battle with chances few and far between for both teams. A tense match drew a huge crowd with family members watching and willing the boys on. Ashton in goal was playing a sweeper and anything over the top he was able to get to, keeping the PGS attack at bay. It was clear that any chance carved out would need to be taken for this game to be won. At half time, it was honours even at 0-0. The boys were up for it, fuelled by the customary Jelly Babies provided by one of the parents.

As the second half began PGS came out strong and created a chance within seconds only for a brilliant last man challenge from Charlie to keep the score 0-0. PGS then grew in confidence without creating many chances. A physical battle fought by all the players involved started to take its toll with a couple of injuries slowing down the game. As the second half rumbled on, Ferndown kept trying to play the game they always have, passing the ball around, using the pace of the attackers to get in behind. With 20 minutes left, a through ball was played and PGS hit the back of the net, but the referees whistle spared Ferndown from going 1-0 for a foul in the build-up.

The game was getting more tense, with substitutes minds starting to think about penalties. With 10 minutes to go, a ball ricocheted nicely to the PGS striker, Ashton made a save and took a whack, but PGS were alive to the second ball and put it in the net for 1-0 PGS. The last 10 minutes were frantic, PGS tried to manage the game whilst Ferndown were pushing for an equaliser. One last corner was hoisted into the box, but Ferndown could not win the first ball and it was cleared. The final whistle went, Ferndown fell to the floor heartbroken after a tough loss.

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### Religious Education Newsletter

#### Exploring Faith, Belief, and Values

As another term comes to a close, we are pleased to share the latest updates from our RE curriculum. This term has been filled with stimulating discussions, interactive learning experiences, and insightful guest visits. Across Years 5 to 8, students have explored fundamental religious and philosophical themes, deepening their understanding of diverse beliefs and worldviews.

#### Year 5 – God’s Plan and the Meaning of Easter

Year 5 students have been exploring *God’s Plan* and the significance of Holy Week. Through discussions on *free will* and *determinism*, they have examined why Christians celebrate Easter and how the events of Holy Week reflect core Christian beliefs. Pupils have engaged in meaningful conversations about choice, destiny, and the role of faith in understanding life’s purpose.

#### Year 6 – The Message of Easter

Year 6 had the privilege of welcoming Miriam from St. Mary’s, who spoke about *the message of Easter*, focusing on *salvation, eternal life, and eternal love*. Using parables from the Bible, role play, and symbolic props, students explored the deeper meanings of Holy Week, making connections between faith and real-life experiences. This hands-on approach allowed pupils to reflect on key Christian teachings and their relevance today.

#### Year 7 – Justice and Humanist Perspectives

As part of their unit on *Justice*, Year 7 students were visited by David Warden from Humanists UK. He shared insights into how Humanists view the world, their core values, and their approach to justice and morality. The students were highly engaged, asking thoughtful questions and considering different perspectives on ethics and fairness. This session provided an excellent opportunity for critical thinking and respectful dialogue on justice beyond religious frameworks.

#### Year 8 – Understanding Suffering Across Religions

Year 8 students have been deeply engaged in their unit on *Suffering*, examining this complex theme from multiple religious perspectives. They have explored:

- Buddhism – The *Four Noble Truths* and the *Eightfold Path*
- Hinduism – The principle of *Ahimsa* (non-violence)
- Christianity – Jesus’ suffering, Christian tests of faith, and philosophical challenges like the *trilemma* and the *inconsistent triad*
- Islam – The role of *Zakah* and *Sadaqah* in alleviating suffering

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Through debates and reflective discussions, students have considered concepts such as *moral and natural evil* and how different faiths provide responses to suffering. Their ability to articulate viewpoints and challenge ideas has been impressive, demonstrating their growing skills in reasoning and ethical reflection.

### Looking Ahead...

We are incredibly proud of our students' curiosity and engagement with these profound topics. As we move forward, we will continue to encourage open-minded discussions, critical thinking, and a deeper understanding of faith and ethics in the modern world.

As we approach the Easter holiday, we would like to wish all our students, staff, and families a joyful and peaceful break. May this season bring reflection, renewal, and time to connect with loved ones. Whether celebrating Easter as a time of faith, hope, or togetherness, we hope it is filled with happiness and meaning.

### Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
